WORSHIP NOTES

Today is the Baptism of our Lord. We hear Mark1:4-11:
Revelation of Christ as God's servant.

A new feature of worship is including someone's favorite hymn during Sunday morning services. Such hymns may be written on the back of attendance cards, one of which will be selected for the following week. If the hymn you submit is chosen, then the church will contact you about it, asking you *why* it's your favorite. The reason that you give will then be included in the Sunday worship announcements.

Why are we doing this? Well, it's one way for us to begin sharing more with one another what our faith means to us. It stems from the R3 Program that the congregation joined this past fall. R3 stands for Reform, Renewal, and Revision, and has to do with new ways by which churches can become revitalized. In other words, one purpose of the R3 Program is to help us learn better how to express our faith in more personal ways. Christians who can better articulate their faith, that is, talk about it with others, both renew and strengthen it for the sake of mission.

If the York City Schools have a delay, cancellation or early dismissal due to snow/bad weather, then the office/staff, child care and tutoring will do the same. On snow/bad weather days, the property department will be at the church to supervise the snow removal contractor and to do sidewalk clearing/salt application. Any evening services/activities that are on the calendar when a snow/bad weather day occurs, could possibly be cancelled or delayed. Always check with the pastor/group leader/chairperson/choir director/property dept./church office or any contact person before coming to the church on a snow/bad weather day. **For Sunday services**, after assessing the Saturday weather conditions, Pastor Watt will determine if the church services are cancelled or delayed.
