### WORSHIP NOTES

Today is the fourth Sunday after the Epiphany. We hear Mark 1:21-28: *The healing of one with an unclean spirit.*

A new feature of worship is including someone's favorite hymn during Sunday morning services. This is one way for us to begin sharing more with one another what our faith means to us. It stems from the R3 Program that the congregation joined this past fall. R3 stands for Reform, Renewal, and Revision.

Today's opening hymn, "The Church's One Foundation", was chosen by Linda Kenée. Linda writes, "We always sang it after Communion (only celebrated a very few times a year) at Trinity Lutheran Church (York) where I grew up."

The hymn-anthem at communion was chosen by Eric Gerz. Eric writes, "I first heard this sung by Christian artist Jeremy Camp. It touches my spirit every time I hear it."

The distribution hymn "O Master, Let Me Walk with You" was chosen by Barbara Steinhilber. Washington Gladden, the hymn's author, is Barbara's great-great-grandfather.
