Today is the seventh Sunday after the Epiphany. We hear Matthew 5:38-48: *The teaching of Christ: love*. Also, we remember Martin Luther on this day of his commemoration.

Today, during the education hour, the Catechetics class and parents are attending a special Reformation presentation at St. Paul's Lutheran, Springettsbury Avenue, called: *Luther 500: A presentation of stories, photos, and historical insights by playwright and actor Steve Seyfried*.

March 1st is Ash Wednesday. There will be services at 12:15 pm in the chapel and 7:00 pm in the Nave. For the Wednesday evenings following Ash Wednesday, the schedule is as follows:

In recognition of the 500th anniversary of the posting of the Ninety-Five Theses by Martin Luther, we will briefly examine and discuss his *Small Catechism*, copies of which will be available.

For those of you who had catechetical studies as youth, this will be a great opportunity to refresh your knowledge of the basics of our faith. If you grew up in another Christian tradition or none at all, then you will benefit from encountering the catechism for the very first time.
